## The problem

- How many smart city/community technology initiatives actually mention citizens and their needs like <u>accessibility</u>, <u>security</u>, <u>privacy</u>, services that function correctly and listen to them?
- Projects, research and industry factor in standards but how many standards factor in the citizen?
- How many cities actually believe standards can help them address citizen needs? And have they been involved in the standardisation process?





To deliver a document as an **ETSI Technical Report**, that will:

- Take a first overview of what the needs of citizens in smart communities are;
  - relate those <u>needs to standardisation activities</u>, ongoing or foreseen, and assess if they are being met;
  - if not, make recommendations as to how to rectify this;
- Lay down some basic principles as to how citizen needs should be addressed.

## STF561 work so far

- Started by defining the work programme, approved by the Technical Committee;
- We have put up web pages on ETSI website;
- On those pages we have placed our <u>stakeholder survey;</u>
- We have informed a large number of relevant groups about the project and hence the survey;
- We have attended events and conferences to present the project;
- We have now drawn up a rough contents list and are beginning to draft texts.



- We see this as **helpful background basis for future findings**, we have tried to circulate it widely
- Objective is **wide**, we would like inputs from standards bodies, projects, cities, etc.
- We'd like people to respond quickly, but the survey will remain on-line until our Phase 2 is launched – for people to comment on our main findings
- Next agenda item will provide a summary of responses so far



## **Project timeline**

- 16 May (today) 1st webinar, presentation of scope/contents for feedback
- May/June 1st stable draft report available, for ETSI HF approval
- June/October public consultation/re-drafting/refinement
- September second awareness seminar to discuss draft report
- November final draft submitted to formal public comment process
- [11] December conference in Brussels to present final draft
- 2020 formal revision and approval process in ETSI
